Thomas Kenny VC

Thomas Kenny was presented with this clock and two bronze statues by the pupils and staff at his former school-St Mary's RC, Wingate, in 1915 after he was awarded his Victoria Cross.

The items have been missing for many years despite a newspaper article informing that they and had been added to the DLI collection, this turned out to be untrue. However after the dedication ceremony in November when Kenny's paving stone was erected in the cemetery, a member of the Kenny family offered the items for display in the Heritage Centre. It is a fantastic 'find' for Wheatley Hill.

WHEATLEY HILL HISTORY CLUB & The Pitmen Poets

On 31 January 2016 Bob Fox, Benny Graham, Jez Lowe and Billy Mitchell, four brilliant individual folk-artists, got together at The Gala Theatre and provided a wonderful night of nostalgia through song, verse and humour about the Durham Coalfield. It was the last night of their 17-date tour around the country and they were well impressed with the reception they received in Durham.

Throughout their performance they projected photographs significant to the days when coal was king in this area, including about 15 images from Wheatley Hill History Club. Our History Club has received free advertising and publicity across the country as a result of these concerts and we should be proud that they chose our photos to represent the past of the coalfield.

MEMORY TOKENS

In order to raise money for The Last Shift, Gordon Tempest is making personalised memory tokens, based on the Pit Tokens that miners took down the pit with them. The scheme is very similar to that offered by Woodhorn Mining Museum, who have a big display of the tokens which have been bought by people wishing to remember their family members who worked in the pits.

Our tokens will be manufactured to order and will be approximately 4" square (or an equivalent size for other shapes). They will be made from metallic-coated brushed bronze-effect, black rigid acrylic and the memory details will be laser-etched onto the surface.

The tokens will cost £10 each, with all proceeds, after costs, being donated to The Last Shift. They will be mounted for display on a memory wall in the Community Centre and/or additional ones for personal possession.

HOLIDAY DIARY

This is a diary kept during a holiday taken in 1948 by Billy and Bella Carr of No 3 Gowland Terrace. They travelled to Scotland with their two sons, Alf and Gordon in their Humber and stayed in a guest house in Ayr for two weeks. Billy kept a diary of their activities during the holiday.

Saturday 14 August 1948

Arrived 4pm. Had tea. Went and had a look around the town. Showery.

Sunday 15 August 1948

Very fine. Went on a mystery tour after tea. Passed Mauchline, Cumnock, New Cumnock, Dalmellington. 3¹/₂ hours ride—coach fare 3/9.

Monday 16 August 1948

Morning fine on sea front. After dinner went with car to Maybole and visited Robert Burns cottage and his monument and gardens. Started to rain so after tea we were off to Odeon Theatre.

Tuesday 17 August 1948

After breakfast off on visit to 3 lakes—Erskine Ferry, Loch Lomond. Route was Ayr, Prestwick, Irvine, Killwinning, Largs, Port Glasgow across Erskine Ferry then on to Balloch for dinner then around Loch Lomond back south down Loch Long onto The Gare Loch. Tea at Helensburgh then Dunbarton, Kilpatrick, Glasgow, Kilmarnock and Ayr. Rain until 2.45pm then fine for rest of day.

Wednesday 18 August 1948

Left Ayr 10.00am. Sailed to Largs then onto sail up 3 lakes. Stopped at Dunoon at 3.10pm for 1 hour. Left Dunoon for Ayr at 4.10pm. Arrived at Ayr 6.45pm. A grand day.

Thursday 19 August 1948

A lovely day. Had a look around town in morning. After dinner got car out and went to Dunure and back to have a look through Butlins Camp at Heads of Ayr.

Friday 20 August 1948

Another lovely day. Went along sea front on morning. Afternoon spent on putting green and at night went to Gaiety Theatre—a grand day.

Saturday 21 August 1948

Rain until tea time. Played cards in lounge then went to Orient Pictures at night. Saw The Swordsman—good show.

Sunday 22 August 1948

Went down by river in morning and after dinner we did about 60 miles in car. Cumnock, Miurkirk, Glenbuck, Drumclog, Darvel, Galston, Ayr.

Monday 23 August 1948

Went to Portpatrick. A lovely ride but showery all day. Dinner at Stranraer and tea at Girvan.

Tuesay 24 August 1948

Went to Isle of Arran in ship. Very rough sea glorious weather on island. Had dinner and tea. Good sailing all the way back.

Wednesday 25 August 1948

Went to Belle Isle Park in morning.

Thursday 26 August 1948

Had look around town and along pier before dinner. After dinner went to Prestwick airport and visited Dutch tearooms. Had tea at Eldon House and later went to pier and saw the boats return with fish.

Friday 27 August 1948


Went shopping in morning. Had dinner went to Prestwick airport. Boys had a trip in plane. After tea played golf then went for a stroll on prom. Packed bags for home before supper.

Saturday 28 August 1948

Had breakfast. Got photo of group staying in same house. Left Ayr 9.40am. Called at Gretna Green. Acted as bride and bridegroom at mock marriage in Smithy. Had dinner In Longtown. Stopped for short time in Hexham. Arrived Home 4.45pm. A grand holiday.
