
## LIMESTONE LANDSCAPE Wheatley Hill and Thornley Village Atlas

#### Summary document—Two Communities of the Magnesian Limestone Plateau

This publication is designed to provide an accessible summary of the history, ecology and geology of Thornley and Wheatley Hill and their surrounding areas. It draws on the work of the recently completed Wheatley Hill/Thornley Village Atlas which was the first to be commissioned through lottery funding by Durham County Council and undertaken by members of the local community and a team of specialists directed by the Archaeological Practice Ltd.

The Village Atlas covers a period in the history of Wheatley Hill and Thornley which has previously been overlooked by researchers. It provides us with the most complete history of the villages and surrounding area ever produced. We now have a time-line of our area from before the Romans to the present day including information on historic buildings, geology, hydrology and ecology, and this, together with research carried out by History Club members mostly concerned with the industrial period, provides a firm basis for further research in the future.

50 Years Without our Pit

Letter from Nicholas and Joanna Smith, step-father and mother to Mary and her husband Walter Buckley who emigrated to West Virginia in 1863. Nicholas Smith was Joanna Proudlock's second husband. Mary is the sister of Lewis Proudlock, the writer of the last letter in this newsletter.

29 April 1889

62 Millbank Terrace Station Town Near Wingate England

My dear sun and doter and grandchilder. I sit down to right hoping to fine you all well as this leaves us beter than we have been. Father has been sick all the winter but he is beter now and rest of us is well and we hav been looken for a leter from you week after weak. We herd from you wen Thomas rot and told us of anns marige we onley got one leter to hear from you as I think I shall never see you in this world but I hope you will meet me in the next. Many a time I wonder wat ceeps you from riten to your mother I no that neither you nor walter can right but the boys can and ann has got married and has no time but tell her to right and let us no how she is getin long with a man. Joanna is dowen well with her man and they have meggys child ceepin and meggy is in place at Coundon and she is beter in her helth. We hope she will ceep her helth and strength. Ralf and his wif was well and john has got his 2 boys to work. We have not sen bell lately and mr flecher is dead and old James haw is dead and we are getin old so our times will com to leave all our frends behind us hoping to meet all our friends in heven so I close this. Send our love to all and father and mother. Best love and do right soon.

#### **Mr Nicholas Smith**

This letter has been written in the Durham dialect by Nicholas Smith who was about 70 years old at the time of writing. He was born in an age when education was not compulsory and so has done well to have acquired any skills of writing. By 1891 Nicholas had been widowed, his wife Joanna died in 1890 and was buried on 26 March in Wingate. Nicholas continued to live with Joanna's son, Lewis Proudlock and his family at Station Town.

#### RECIPES FROM A VICTORIAN 'RECEIPTS' BOOK

The following is from a Victorian receipts (now called recipe) book which was handed down by husband's great grandmother but not examined closely—until now! All the recipes are handwritten and we estimate date from the 1890's. This is one of her recipes for cough mixture—there were a further two which contained even more obscure ingredients such as syrup of squill!

#### COUGH MIXTURE(1)

Boil together 1 stick of liquorice, 1lb of treacle, 1 quart of water till reduced to 3 gills. When cold add following ingredients: 1oz of paregoric, 4 drachms laudanum, ½oz of spirits of wine, 1d worth of aniseed.





#### **KEY TO THE TERMS:**

**Paregoric:** camphorated tincture of opium

**Laudanum:** a tincture of opium

**Spirits of Wine:** an archaic name for ethanol

Syrup of Squill: medicinal plant of the lily family

#### Units of measure used in the preparations

There are eight drachms to the ounce and three scruples to the drachm and 20 grains to the scruple.

One Troy ounce is equal to 31.1 grammes,
